Giving Generously starts with trust!

May: Giving

Generous giving is core to our identity as disciples. Jesus often challenged people to give generously for the mission of the church. Paul says, we are invited to enjoy the act of giving. So, we encourage one another to joyfully give generously to our ministries during this Easter season. Below are four stewardship challenges we encourage each other to practice.

Challenge One (Quantity giving): We encourage one another to give an offering every Sunday during May. For some of us we are monthly givers, and for others we may give every other week or when we are in church. We encourage one another wherever we are on the spectrum to try and give an offering every week to remember that God is our provider and source of everything we have. Giving to us all the time.

Challenge Two: (Giving amount): We encourage each other to give 1% more than we normally give in a one-month period during the month of May. This challenge invites us to grow in faith and trust knowing that even though we may be giving more then we think we can afford, we believe that God will provide. If we want to challenge ourselves even more, we invite one another to try tithing (10%) our gross earnings during the month of May. If we already tithe, may we challenge ourselves to increase our giving's for the Sundays in May by another 2%.

Challenge Three: (Priority giving): We encourage each other to take the next couple of days to reflect on what kind of material things we like to spend our money on. Then we encourage one another to sacrifice one of those things and redirect the money to the ministry during the month of May.
